




Early Childhood Education




- Significantly expand publicly-funded full-day pre-K for all 4-year-olds and low-income 3-year-olds through a public private delivery system
- Increase number of high-quality early childhood education providers and educators
- Expand supports for young children and their families
- Fully fund the Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program
- Improve student readiness for kindergarten

High-quality and Diverse Teachers and Leaders




- Increase rigor of educator licensure and prep programs
- Improve educator compensation and working conditions
 - 10% Salary Increase between FY2019-FY2024 (COLA's only)
 - \$10,000 salary increase for NBCT (additional \$7,000 for working in a "Low-Performing School")
 - \$60,000 starting teacher salary by FY2026.
- Institute new recruitment and professional development efforts to create a more diverse educator workforce
- Establish new statewide educator career ladder to continually improve professional practice and student performance
 - New Career Ladder for Teachers and Administrations must be negotiated and implemented by July 1, 2024 (FY2025)
- Implement more comprehensive in-service educator training and professional development

College and Career Readiness




- Implement preK-12 curriculum for students to be college and career ready (CCR) by the end of 10th grade
- Develop an aligned instructional system with resources and supports necessary to keep students on track to be CCR
- Provide students with resources necessary to achieve reading proficiency by the end of grade 3
- Create a statewide framework for rigorous CTE programs and skills standards
- Establish pathways for CCR and non-CCR students in grades 11 and 12
 - Post-CCR pathways for CCR students in the 11th and 12th grades at no cost to the student by FY2024
 - Intervention for students who are not CCR by the end of 10th grade beginning in FY2024

More Resources to Ensure that All Students are Successful



- Provide more support for students and schools who need it most, specifically, additional supports for English learners, low-income, and special education students
- Provide new Concentration of Poverty grants directly to eligible schools to support community schools and enhance wraparound services
- Coordinate community supports to meet student behavioral health needs and provide technical assistance to school systems

Governance and Accountability



- Establish the Accountability and Implementation Board (AIB) to oversee and monitor state and local agencies' progress in implementing Blueprint policies
- Develop state and local Blueprint implementation plans
 - 25% revenue withholding if implementation plans are not approved
- Create expert review teams to visit schools and make recommendations for improving student achievement
- Require school systems to demonstrate that at least 75% of per-student formula funding follows students to their schools
 - Reporting begins on July 1, 2024 (FY2025) based on allocations (budget).
 - Mid-Year reporting due every January.
 - ESSA reporting actual expenditures by school.
 - Districts will need to make significant structural changes to finance processes.
- Counties must provide the greater of Maintenance of Effort (MOE) or Local Share

Accountability & Implementation Board

The Blueprint emphasizes the work needed to ensure the successful implementation and evaluation of the legislation's programs and initiatives. The goal of the Kirwan Commission was to "establish a mechanism to ensure excellence for all through governance and accountability," with the establishment of the new Accountability and Implementation Board (AIB). This seven-member board is charged with overseeing the comprehensive implementation of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future.

AIB hosts public hearing on the draft Comprehensive Plan in November 2022

AIB (and MSDE) begins to provide training and technical assistance to LEAs and govt units on developing Blueprint Implementation Plans

Winter 2023

AIB (and MSDE) continues to provide training and technical assistance on Blueprint Implementation Plans

Blueprint Implementation Plans submitted to AIB by every State and local entity that is required to implement the Blueprint by March 15, 2023

Spring 2023

AIB reviews LEA and other govt units' Blueprint Implementation Plans for approval or revision

AIB determines whether LEA funds are released/other govt units' funds are withheld for FY 24
